QUESTIONS TO ASK ON A TOUR

Before you visit, you can get a general overview of a senior living residence by asking a few key questions:

- I am looking to move in [mention your time frame]. What is your suite availability like?
- What suite types do you offer?
 What is the average size of the suite?
 Does it include a kitchen or kitchenette?
- What is included in the monthly rent?

- Does your building have (amenities most important to you, e.g. pool, private dining room, guest suites)?
- Is there scheduled transportation or shuttle service?
- If my health changes and I need assistance with daily living or memory care, will I have to move?

Taking a tour of a seniors' residence is the best way to see the amenities and learn about the services. You might like to ask the following questions if they're not already answered during your visit.

The building

- When was the residence built? Most recent renovation?
- Do you have smoke detectors, carbon monoxide detectors and sprinklers in every suite and throughout the building?
- How often do you practice fire drills?
- Is there underground resident parking? Is guest parking available? Is there a fee for parking?
- Are there storage lockers? Is there a fee for using one?
- Do you allow pets? Can I have pets visit me?
